What To Expect From The Rental Market

Be sure to read the agreement carefully before signing and ask any questions you may have. It protects you from illegal evictions as well as gives you some responsibilities to follow.

Deposit Protection Schemes

Landlords are required by law to protect your deposit in a government-approved scheme. This ensures that you will get your deposit back at the end of the tenancy

If you've met all the conditions of the agreement. Please note that in some cases deposit may be used to cover your last month of tenancy, therefore not required to be protected on a government scheme.

This is usually called advance payment, rent in advance or further advance payment on your tenancy agreement.

Maintenance and Repairs

As a tenant, you have the right to expect a certain level of maintenance and repairs to be carried out on the property.

It's the landlord's responsibility to ensure that the property is safe and in good condition, so be sure to report any issues as soon as possible.



The rental market in London can be challenging, but with some research and preparation, you can find a suitable rental property that meets your needs and budget.

Be sure to ask questions, read agreements carefully, and work with reputable letting agents to ensure a smooth rental experience.
